### 1. Call to Order

- Meeting commenced at approximately 7:00 PM.

- Chair welcomed members back after the summer break.

# 2. Special Presentation - Elk Management in WMU 212 & 312

- Presenter: Joe Baranyay (Club Member & Zone 2 Wildlife Chair, Alberta Wildlife Federation)
- Background: Government and landowner concerns over rising elk populations in WMU 212 and surrounding areas.
- Population Trends: WMU 212 grew from ~200 to 2,600+ elk; WMU 312 estimated at 1,200+ elk.
- Past Management: Trapping and relocation (stopped during COVID), extended archery/primitive weapon seasons, landowner access programs.
- Issues: Restricted access, crop and fence damage, landowners requesting more control over tags.
- Government Proposals: Extended primitive weapon seasons, landowner-specific tags, possible center-fire rifle use.
- Alberta Wildlife Federation Response: Support selective draw licenses, caution against landowner-only allocation, promote ethical insured hunters from clubs.

# 3. Discussion Points Raised by Members

- Concerns over hunter safety with large elk herds and high hunter concentration.
- Fairness of landowner-only licensing debated.

- Suggested systems: centralized access list, club-managed programs; concerns about administration and fairness.
- Consensus: balance needed between landowner rights, hunter access, and herd reduction.

## 4. Alberta Wildlife Federation Updates

- Ongoing dialogue with government on regulations.
- Changes: bow draw weights lowered ( $45 \rightarrow 35$  lbs), tracking dogs allowed on leash, youth hunting rules clarified, firearms regulations updated.
- Cougar hunting: request to reinstate non-dog hunting opportunities.
- Advocacy for more shooting range approvals across Alberta.

## 5. Club Business & Reports

- Annual Banquet (June): raised ~\$5,000; next banquet 2026, date to be determined volunteers needed.
- Summer Family BBQ:  $\sim 30$  attendees, included raffle (274/1000 tickets sold). Decision pending on raffle for 2026.
- Upcoming Conference: Alberta Wildlife Federation Annual Conference, Feb 19–21, 2026, Carriage House Hotel, Calgary. Clubs asked to support youth program.
